



Introduction





Bristol City Council needs more money to pay for the services we provide to people in Bristol.

This is because:

• The cost of providing services is going up a lot.



• More people need services from the council.

To make sure the council doesn't run out of money next year, we think we will need to:

• Ask people in Bristol to pay more in taxes to the council each month.



 Change some of the services we provide

 this will include providing less of some services, and stopping some services completely.

Council Tax



Bristol City Council is looking at how much **Council Tax** we ask people to pay next year 2023 to 2024.



Council Tax is money that people pay to their local council for services like libraries, emptying bins and fixing the roads.



If we ask people to pay more Council Tax it will help pay for the services we need to provide. **Question 1:** Which of these options would you prefer?





No increase to Council Tax. This means the council may not be able to pay for all the services people need.







A small increase in Council Tax of about 28 pence a week for most people. Bigger houses would pay more, up to 73 pence extra a week.

This would give the council £2.5 million extra to pay for services next year.

An increase in Council Tax of about 57 pence a week for most people. Bigger houses would pay more, up to £1.46 extra each week.

This would give the council £5 million extra to pay for services next year.



An increase in Council Tax of about 85 pence a week for most people. Bigger houses would pay more, up to £2.19 extra each week.

This would give the council £7.5 million extra to pay for services next year.

Extra money for social care



Social care is the extra support some people need with everyday things such as personal care.



There are many more people in Bristol who need social care.




If the council asks people to pay money on top of Council Tax, it will help to pay towards the extra cost of social care.



The extra money of top of Council Tax is called a 'social care precept'.

Bigger increases in Council Tax




The government is thinking about telling councils that they can charge even more Council Tax and money towards social care.

This would help councils to improve the services they provide.






Children and young people

Idea 1: Finding and training more **foster parents** so we don't have to pay for children to live in expensive places outside Bristol.




A **foster parent** is someone who looks after a homeless child in their own home.

Climate change is all about big changes in the weather. For example, storms getting worse than they used to be. Climate change will be bad for people, animals and plants in Bristol and around the world.


People cause climate change by burning gas or oil. We burn oil when we travel and we burn gas and oil when we heat buildings.

The council is working to change how we travel and heat our buildings so there is less climate change.






Idea 12: Many of our services are for people who don't have much money. We have to work out how much money people have, so we know how much help we can give them.



We want to make sure this work is well organised so that we are not doing extra work that isn't needed.









The council helps some organisations pay less **Business Rates.**






Idea 18: We want to look at how the different services for very young children and their families can work together better. We may provide more support online and need fewer staff and buildings.






Idea 24: We will look at better ways to support people at Redfield Lodge - this is a care home for older people who need a lot of help.




Idea 25: We will look at better ways to support people at Concord Lodge - this is a care home for young people with a learning disability.

We may move the central library to a different place.


