Several recommendations were made by residents, NHS colleagues, Cheshire East Council staff and representatives from VCFSE organisations during the engagement phase of this strategy. These recommendations form the basis for an initial delivery plan which is enclosed within this document.

There will be more ideas that we haven't yet heard and, as such, this plan will remain flexible with CEDIP continuing to add developing ideas to the table.

The timescales for each activity will be confirmed by CEDIP to ensure that agreed timescales are feasible for all those who will contribute towards their success.

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Improve Connectivity	Connectivity in certain areas such as those that are particularly rural was raised.  Connectivity ranged from poor to intermittent at best by some residents and a suggestion as made to improve this across the area.	This is an ongoing project, led by four local authorities across Cheshire – Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester, Halton and Warrington borough councils – to "deliver faster broadband to areas where it had not been commercially viable to invest previously, in particular our outlying and rural communities". Free Wi-Fi Access	Providing free Wi-Fi access to those in social housing was raised by a VCFSE sector employee. Masts could provide Wi-Fi to those who cannot afford it, and whilst the speed of this broadband may not be fast given the likely number of users, it would be a good start for improving access.	We will explore how this has worked in other areas and whether housing-based organisations could provide digital support in this capacity.  We will also explore further opportunities for free Wi-Fi access and communicating this effectively across the borough.	Cheshire East Digital Inclusion Partnership	Residents who are facing a barrier of Wi-Fi affordability have fair opportunities to access the internet.

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Social Value	A VCFSE representative raised whether digital inclusion could be a social value topic for organisations who are commissioned by organisations such as Cheshire East.
