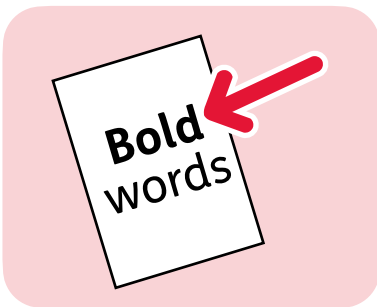
Easy Read



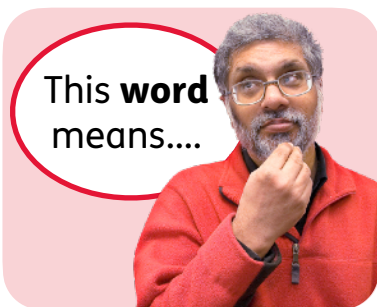
This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.

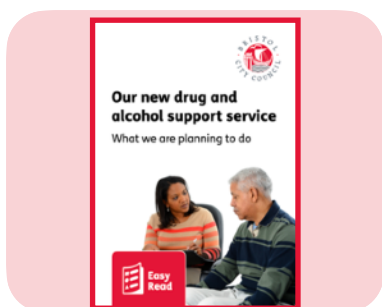
Bristol City Council is thinking about our service for people who have drug and alcohol problems.

Question 3: What do you think about this, and how can we make it work well?



We plan to provide drugs and alcohol services in people's local area.



Question 4: How can we get better at providing drugs and alcohol services in people's local areas?



We are thinking of starting a service that is like **rehab**, but for people who cannot stay away from home for a long time.



Rehab is where you stay in a place to help you get better from your drug or alcohol problems.



With this new service, people could get a lot of help during the day, but go home at night.



Question 5: What do you think of this idea?



We want the new provider to help people go to rehab if they need it.



This means:

- Checking if it is right for them.



- Deciding how to pay for it.



- Finding a place for them to go.



- Checking how they are doing.



Question 6: Do you have any thoughts about how the new provider can help people go to rehab?



Some people need medicines to help them get better from drug or alcohol problems.



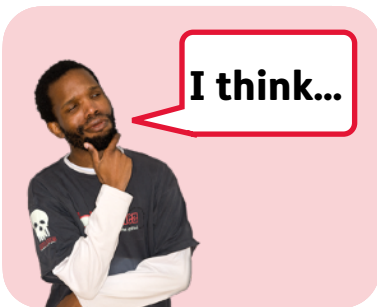
Usually, local doctors give them these medicines.



But some people need extra help, like people who have left prison, or people who are homeless.



We would like to have a special service for people when they need extra help.



Question 7: What do you think about this idea?



We want to carry on supporting people who have stopped using drugs or alcohol.



We want to help them not start using drugs or alcohol again.



Question 8: What do you think might make this difficult for us?

We want drugs and alcohol services to be:



- Easy to use.



- Right for people from different groups and different parts of Bristol.

We want our new drugs and alcohol service to include services for children and young people.

We provide support for families and carers who have been affected by another person's problems with drugs or alcohol.

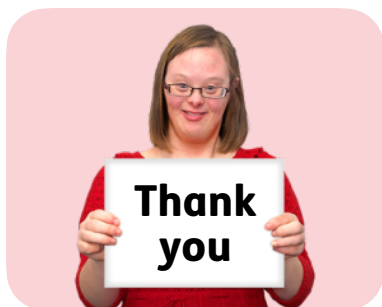
A **refugee** or **asylum seeker** is someone who has left their own country and asked to live in a new country to stay safe.
